## PASTOR'S LETTER Pastor R. Winston Presnall

#### Dear Steppers,

In the comedy movie, "What About Bob?," an exchange between therapist and client highlighted baby steps.

Marvin: It means setting small, reasonable goals for yourself. One day at a time, one tiny step at a time: do-able, accomplishable goals. Bob: Baby steps.

Marvin: When you leave this office, don't think about everything you have to do to get out of the building, just deal with getting out of the room.

March seems a few long strides ago. The successive months were full of baby steps. The baby steps seemed uphill against the gravity of restrictions and a mysterious, powerful viral foe. We literally dealt with getting out of the room. Office staff protocol, schedules, off-campus, in-home clerical work, redirecting ourselves from one place to another in geography and psychology. "Honey, I'm home!" Who says that now? "We're all home!" We've been banished to home exile by the barbarian virus, a Trojan-Gift-Bug whose forces are legion. The "Gift-Bug" arrives in the familiarity of friend or family unknowingly turned into carrier-foe.

Remember the commercial where the bathroom medicine cabinet is opened by a guest? All the meds fall off the shelves and scatter on the floor. The narrator: "Want to get away?" YES.



Judging by the our social-critter-natures, we raced back to parties, bars and eating indoors. Too quickly. Most churches are negotiating the "return to church" compulsion with carefully, decent and orderly steps. Baby steps. Social distancing requiring a 10 foot radius around a person. In our downstairs sanctuary, that gives us 20 such social distance circles—about 20 to 23 people. Maybe 25. And no singing. Wearing masks. Disinfecting every chair, even those labeled: "Do not sit here!" (Labeled not by any long term congregant who has always sat there!) Cleaning instructions for use of the restroom. Carefully placed hand sanitizing stations. 6 foot reminders of social distancing under foot. No common food tables. No coffee stations. Donuts banished from the kingdom.

We are exiled from face to face, personal worship...right now. Right now, we are learning the baby steps for our return.

Baby steps are good. Encouraging. I watched Hailey, our granddaughter, take a few steps without assistance on a FaceTime call this past Sunday. Hailey amazed herself. Of course, she fell like Peter through the glassy sea after a few baby steps. Plopped right down on her padded, diapered touche. Her parents were surrounding her...all four hands and four arms...to keep her from falling into something hard.

We'll take baby steps to get back to church, together. We want to make sure we don't fall into something hard, deadly! We'll walk in faithful baby steps, trusting that God desires us to take strides without falling into harder times.

## How Do WE ORGANIZE SUNDAY WORSHIP? James Keniston

Sunday worship is always available for our congregation and visitors. Considering that the church has been in operation since 1874 – at the same location – that equates to approximately 7,614 Sunday Worship services over 146 years. For the staff that work together to ensure that the service happens each week, it is planned like a production, and that's a good thing, because that mindset and attention to detail helps to ensure that it all runs smoothly. The worship committee of course meet to make major decisions about the content and arrangement of Worship and various elements such as music, communion, décor, assigning and recruiting our liturgists and readers. But week-by-week the process goes something like this:



**Monday:** Pastor Winston delivers the service outline to James, who reviews and adds music information provided by Caitlin and Grace. Reminders are sent to those who have committed to participate in the service such as our liturgists and children's messengers. A draft is sent out to Worship staff for any revisions and so that everyone now sees the full content of the service and can begin to prepare accordingly.

**Tuesday:** The service outline is finalized and sent out by James, with additional items, to all participants in the service including our liturgists/readers so that they can prepare their video segments and transfer to us.

Wednesday: Any last-minute details are discussed at our staff meeting, along with other relevant church business. Caitlin and James prepare certain files that go into the final edit of the Sunday service such as the choir video, sermon quotations and tran-



sition slides. These are all placed into shared Dropbox folders that can be jointly accessed wherever we happen to be working that day.

**Thursday:** Pastor Winston, Caitlin, Grace and Jourdan (our production technician) meet in the Sanctuary to record the various musical and liturgical elements that will be edited together by Jourdan into our final broadcast-ready video.

**Thursday/Friday:** Jourdan takes all the segments that he has recorded Thursday, as well as items submitted by Caitlin, James and our liturgist participants, and edits together the video. He then uploads to our Facebook page.

Of course there are other more minute details each week that ensure a successful production, and a lot of preparation time by our Worship staff for the actual content, however this is the basic process. It is broadly similar to preparing for Sunday Worship in person, but, like every church, we have had to adapt and our roles have all changed a little bit too. Fortunately we have the technology available in our world that has made this possible as a relatively seamless transition.

### HEALTH MINISTRY



August is National Immunization Awareness Month. While we all are hoping that a vaccine for COVID-19 will be here soon, the Center for Disease Control (CDC) reminds us we also need to take the various vaccines that are available to help protect us from serious illnesses. It is important to

know which shots you need and when to get them. All adults need a seasonal flu shot every year. Other shots work best when they are given at certain ages. There are schedules for shots for children and adolescents that you can obtain from your doctor. People 60 or older should get a shot to prevent shingles, if they had chickenpox in the past. There is now a better shot to prevent shingles called RZV (recombinant zoster vaccine). It is given in two doses 2-6 months apart. People 65 or older should get two pneumococcal vaccines - one dose of PCV13 (conjugate vaccine) followed by one dose of PPSV23 (polysaccharide vaccine). Adults also need to have a shot for tetanus and diphtheria every ten years.

#### August News

We made it! The first day of preschool for all of our returning students is August 3rd. We are happy to have three full classrooms with full time students ages 6 weeks-6 years old. **OPPS** will be operating a lot differently:

- There are three sanitation stations in the preschool that supply the students with hand sanitizer and tissues and supply the teachers with Clorox wipes, Lysol spray, gloves, paper towels and masks.
- Parents drop off the students outside the school and teachers bring the children into the classroom.
- No shoes are allowed in the school.
- Classrooms are filled with half the capacity of students as before.
- Staff is not rotating between classrooms but remaining with the same students throughout the day.
- Temperature checks and screening questions are asked for each child daily at drop-off.
- Lots of cleaning!

But not to worry, there is still a lot of the same happening too! Children are with their peers and loving teachers, learning to share, doing art projects, playing, and of course learning about Jesus!


